Suggested Courses

There are 2 suggested courses - see alongside the map together with the control descriptions

Instructions

Start and Finish at the purple triangle.

The exercise is to proceed from control to control in a set order (see suggested courses)'

At each control is a post with a red and white triangle on top.

On the post is the code number for the control (1-16) as well as a code letter.

Record the code letter in the box to the right as proof you have visited the control*

*You can also use a SmartPhone app (called MapRun) to record that you have visited the controls, show your time for completing the course and allow comparison with other users. For more details: www.octavian-droobers.org/index.php/maprun/about-maprun

The map and course details

Orienteering maps are specially drawn using internationally agreed symbols and colours to describe the terrain, vegetation and other features. See the legend alongside the map.

The purple triangle on the map indicates the start and finish of the course.

Purple circles indicate the position of the controls, the control being found at the centre of the circle.

Alongside each circle is a number that is the control number as on the control description list.

A compass is not necessary to navigate round the course but may be useful.

The course is open all year round, but always remember that there are seasonal variations in vegetation which affect visibility and runnability.

These courses have been designed to be interesting and to encourage people to explore the park.
